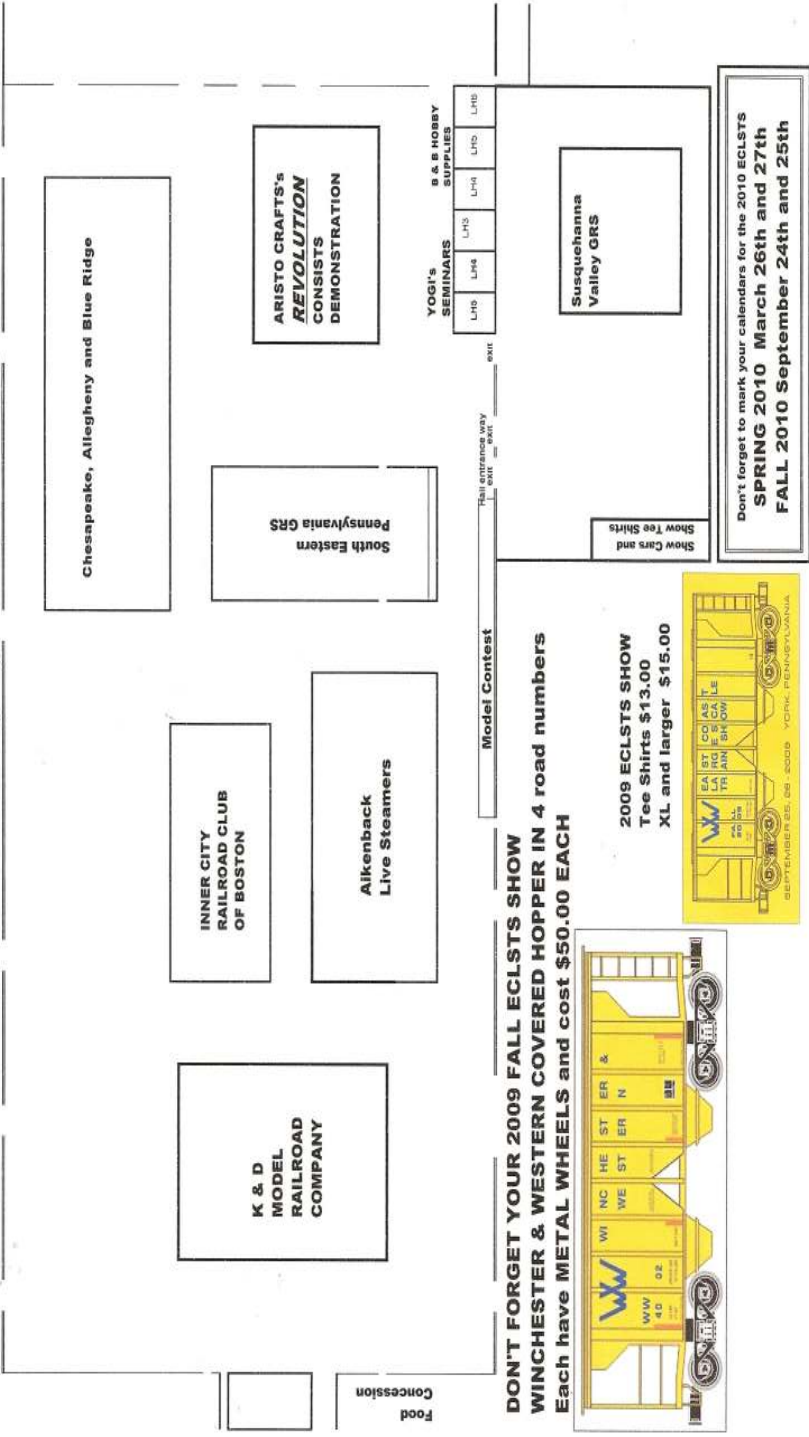

Category Details

(A) Dioramas:

Any model incorporated into a display with other models, figures, etc. that tells a story or presents a snapshot of an activity.

Kitbashing:

A commercially available, assembled product or kit that has been modified.

(B) Self-Propelled: (Example: Engines, Trolley, Trains, etc) Items entered into this category must be self-propelled so that the unit has the ability to move on the track. Engines with rolling stock constitute a train.

(C) Rolling Stock: These can be any item that is drawn behind an engine that does not have its own motor that is used to move the unit on the track.

(D) Structures: A bridge or building that was created from a commercially available kit or a pre-built unit that has been modified or changed with additional parts.

Scratch Built:

A model built primarily from scratch or assembled from a variety of other components. At least 51% of the model must be made from parts created by the modeler.

(E) Self-Propelled: (Example: Engines, Trolley, Trains, etc) Items entered into this category must be self-propelled so that the unit has the ability to move on the track. Engines with rolling stock constitute a train.

(F) Rolling Stock: These can be any item that is drawn behind an engine that does not have its own motor that is used to move the unit on the track.

(G) Structures: A bridge or building in which the model parts were fabricated by the builder with a limited quantity of commercially available items added for detail.

(H) Whimsical:

This model should be fun. It can be from a kit or scratch built. It can be an engine, trolley, train, rolling stock, building, bridge or any combination of the above. It can be in scale, out of scale, or out of this world. The items entered should be in the 1:32 to 1:20.3 scale range.

Prizes:

Ribbons: First, Second and Third place ribbons will be awarded in each of the categories: A-B-C-D-E-F-G-H at each show.

Prizes: There are gift certificates awarded at each show. The total award amounts for each prize are: Best of Show-\$1000MSRP, 1st Place Over All-\$500MSRP, 2nd-Place Over All-\$200MSRP, 3rd-Place Over All-\$100MSRP. 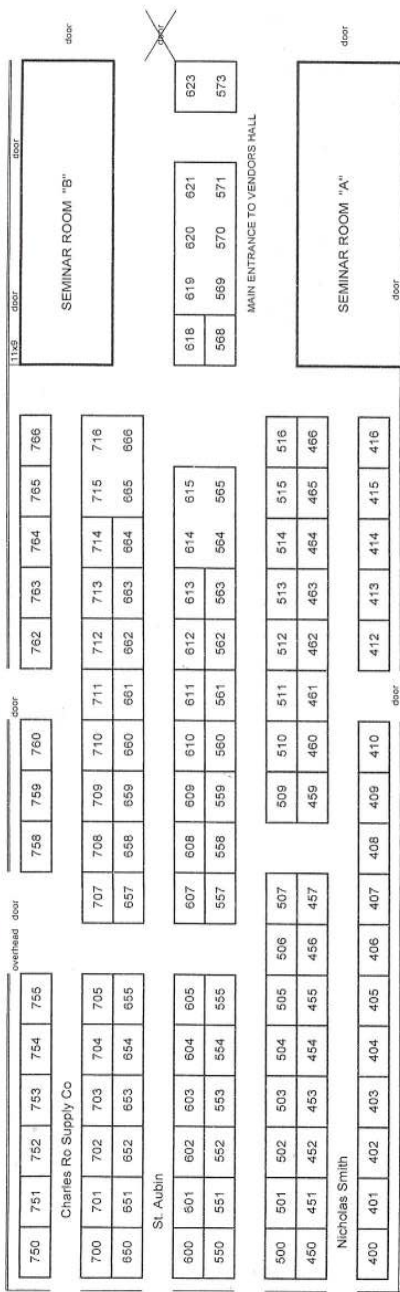
